She said: "My confidence wasn't great due to health problems, I had been out of work for a very long time, I was of a certain age group, being in my midfifties. Maybe some companies were willing to employ me, but not having the confidence I didn't get much success."

Livija said: "A long time ago I thought that only retired people volunteered in charity shops. But that has changed - I have

"I now feel a lot more comfortable helping others.

"I enjoy the social aspect, being able to work with other people, plus I have learnt new skills like using the till. I am more confident and my self-esteem has improved."
